

#BeeWell Schools Offer 2023-2024

There are a range of sessions available to #BeeWell partner schools to support them to understand and interpret survey data, plan their response using accessible resources, and to engage the school community in exploring their survey results.

Sessions for young people, parents and carers, school staff and wider stakeholders, can be delivered for an individual school or within a wider group (such as at Trust or locality level).

One-to-one support session with the Child Outcomes Research Consortium (CORC)

This 30-60 minute session for #BeeWell leads will guide them through the #BeeWell dashboard to interpret the data and:

- support them to identify priorities,
- plan next steps for addressing areas of challenge,
- consider how to engage young people, staff and parents with the findings.

Offer for individual schools

Responding to your #BeeWell data workshop

This workshop is for **senior and middle leaders** to explore and interpret their #BeeWell data in order to plan their response. The workshop will guide staff through their #BeeWell dashboard, considering longitudinal data over the three years and demographic data to track changes and inequalities, alongside the context of wider Greater Manchester level data. Activities and discussion will be guided to support staff to plan responses to the data.

The workshop can be delivered online or in person (subject to availability), up to a half-day session.

Engaging pupils in the #BeeWell survey response workshop

This two-hour workshop is for **up to 15 Year 10 pupils** and will be co-delivered in-person with a member of school staff. Pupils will be supported to understand and interpret their school's #BeeWell data and consider ways to address these challenges through guided group activities and discussion. At the end of the

session, pupils will present their ideas to be shared with school staff. Reflections on a similar event which took place last year can be found [here](#).

Engaging parents and carers in the #BeeWell survey response session

This 90-minute session will be co-delivered with a senior member of staff for 10-15 **parents and carers**. The aim of the session is to engage parents and carers in school wellbeing by exploring #BeeWell data. Through group activities and discussions, parents will consider ways to address these challenges, enabling learning on an individual level, and also giving them the opportunity to feedback their ideas about mental health and wellbeing support in school.

Offer for groups of schools

Working with staff

These sessions can be delivered for up to 15 schools across a Trust, Local Authority or other grouping during a half-day session to promote collaboration, share learning between professionals in different settings and to discuss good practice:

Responding to your #BeeWell data workshop (mainstream settings)

This workshop is for **school staff** to explore and interpret their #BeeWell data in order to plan their response. The workshop will guide staff through their #BeeWell dashboard, considering longitudinal data over the three years and demographic data to track changes and inequalities, alongside the context of wider Greater Manchester level findings. Activities and discussion will be guided to share learning across the past three years and to discuss strategies to address challenges with colleagues.

Responding to your #BeeWell data workshop (specialist and alternative provision)

This session follows the same structure as above but is adapted for specialist settings such as **Special Schools, Pupil Referral Units and Alternative Provision** to include Greater Manchester level data collected from the short and symbol surveys. Activities and discussion will be guided to share learning across the past three years and to discuss strategies to address challenges with colleagues.

Working with young people

The following session can be delivered for up to 5 schools, with 5-6 pupils and an accompanying member of staff from each school:

Engaging students in the survey response workshop

This two-hour workshop is for **Year 10 pupils** and will be co-delivered in-person with a member of school staff. Pupils will be supported to understand and interpret their school's #BeeWell data and consider ways to address these challenges through guided group activities and discussion. At the end of the session, pupils will present their ideas to be shared with school staff.

Working across a locality

The aim of this session is to facilitate a workshop which brings together professionals across a local area which support children and young people's mental health and wellbeing to share learning from #BeeWell and create a coordinated response to the survey. This could include **senior staff from schools, local leaders, Mental Health Support Teams, community and voluntary sector organisations.**

Engaging professionals in an area-level response workshop

This session bring together professionals to explore #BeeWell data at a locality level to identify inequalities and explore successes and areas of challenge. Professionals from different organisations will be supported through activities and discussion to consider the results within their local network and raise awareness of the provision available, share learning across the past three years and discuss strategies to address these challenges with colleagues as part of a cohesive, coordinated, locally-led response.
