



#BeeWell Greater Manchester 2024/25

Essential information for non-mainstream schools

#BeeWell uses a co-designed wellbeing survey to listen to the voices of as many young people as possible; publishes the results privately to schools and publicly by neighbourhood; and drives action across society to improve young people's wellbeing. Participating #BeeWell schools receive...

Schools with more than 10 survey responses receive bespoke feedback, either through a confidential data dashboard or in the form of a school report, which can be used to explore what your pupils have said about their wellbeing and navigate differences across gender, free school meal eligibility, SEN status and year group.

Once you have received your #BeeWell Survey data, we offer a range of support to help you explore the survey results, identify priorities and plan your next steps. This includes 1:1 sessions on your school data, workshops to share the findings back with young people and staff, and much more: [Responding to the #BeeWell survey](#).



What do we ask of schools?

We ask schools to facilitate the delivery of the online [survey](#) during the Autumn Term each year. Additional support has been implemented for non-mainstream schools, including the creation of a [short and symbol](#) version of the survey accessible to young people with special educational needs, providing the option to stop and start the survey as required, completion with support of a trusted adult, a flexible survey window and an offer of in-person #BeeWell Team support. We can also put a bespoke data sharing agreement in place for APs and PRUs, to ensure we have the most up to date pupil information for young people to take part.

Years 7 and 10 will be surveyed in autumn 2024, however non-mainstream schools have the option to survey all year groups.

What else happens with the survey responses?

The #BeeWell data is also made publicly available (using pupil home neighbourhood) on our #BeeWell neighbourhood dashboard. We also publish an annual report on the findings across Greater Manchester and frequent research papers and briefings on specific drivers of young people's wellbeing. We make the #BeeWell data publicly available as we believe young people's wellbeing is everybody's business.
